

Work Placements

Work Placement is a vital part of all the courses we offer at Linx Institute. This regular interaction with industry professionals provides students with the opportunity to practice and reinforce the knowledge they have learnt in the classroom. English Language Requirements

- Academic IELTS 6.0 or equivalent with no individual band under 5.5; or
- Successful Completion of an Advanced ELICOS course prior to Linx course; or
- A Certificate IV level qualification (or higher) completed from the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) in Australia within 2 years of commencing course with Linx Institute; or
- Successful Completion of Year
 12 in Australia

Exemption of English Proficiency Evidence

Students who are citizens of and hold a passport from the United Kingdom, the United States of America, Canada (excluding Quebec), New Zealand or the Republic of Ireland, are not required to present evidence of English proficiency as part of their application.

- Vaccination and health screenings (*CHC30121 and CHC50121)
- Additional evidence that work placement providers may require

Language Literacy & Numeracy Requirements

Before you are able to commence your studies at Linx Institute, you will need to successfully complete the Language Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) online test. Please note that if you are applying for more than one course with us, you will only need to omplete the LLN test once. The purpose of the LLN test is to insure you have the LLN skills needed to undertake your course. Will also show how we can assist you in any areas where you hay need help while studying with us.





At Linx institute, our early childhood courses give you a broad understanding of how to care for children aged 0-6 years old in an Early Childhood Centre or a Family Daycare setting. You will cover the fundamentals of how to be a professional caring educator, provide in-home care and Early Childhood Centre based care.

Employment opportunities include running your own family daycare, becoming a room leader or supervisor, all the way up to becoming a director of an Early Childhood Centre. The possibilities are endless for Linx students. We are committed to helping students find work placements in the industry and arrange these for our international students. 



Receive offer letter

If your application is successful, you will receive a Letter of Offer and a Written Agreement which has the details of your nominated course, course fees and refund policies.

Accept your offer and make payment

To complete the enrolment process, sign and submit the Written Agreement and pay the required upfront fees. Details of agreement submission and payment will be included in the Letter of Offer.

Receive Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE)

Once we received the offer acceptance, initial payments, and other documentation required in the conditional offer letter (if any). Your Admissions Officer will issue a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE).
